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MARXIST - LENINIST ATHEISM

Vladimir Lenin, was a Russian revolutionary, politician, and political theorist. He served as the first and founding head of government of Soviet Russia from 1917 to 1924 and of the Soviet Union from 1922 to 1924. Vladimir was a Soviet atheist who promoted marxism. He referred to marxism as materialism. Vladimir believed that the ABC of all materialism and consequently marxism was to combat religion. He wrote, "down with religion and long live atheism; the dissemination of atheist views is our chief task!"

One of the most dangerous threats to spiritual life is materialism. When a person sets their heart on the things of the world, naturally their longing for eternal realities trickles away.

<u>Ecclesiastes 5:10</u> He that loveth silver shall not be satisfied with silver; nor he that loveth abundance with increase: this is also vanity.

The love of money increases, in proportion as money itself increases. People who set their hearts on material possessions will never be satisfied.

SINISTER SELFISHNESS

Mark 8:36-37 For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul?

The Saviour saw that men were absorbed in getting gain, and were losing sight of eternal realities. He undertook to correct this evil. He sought to break the infatuating spell that was paralyzing the soul. The infatuating spirit of selfishness is death. All the money and possessions of the world cannot redeem a human soul from eternal death. In comparison with the value of one soul, the whole world sinks into insignificance.
